

a look back CACCC ANNUAL REPORT 2020 FISCAL YEAR 07.01.19 - 06.30.20

The 2020 fiscal year was both unpredictable and unprecedented. The impact COVID-19 had on the children and families we serve was profound. During the height of the pandemic, we saw a 28% increase in Family Advocacy and Support Services, underscoring the fact that our clients had more critical needs than ever before. We also saw a 51% increase in the need for crisis intervention due to increased depression, anxiety, and suicidal thoughts in the children we were serving. The isolation and stress of the pandemic had a serious impact on the mental health of our children.

Over the past year, we were committed to ensuring that all client services and projects continued in a safe and socially distanced manner, so that we could continue to meet the critical needs of our clients and promote healing for the children and families we serve. The pandemic certainly caused us to shift the way we had to provide services, but nothing was going to deter us from making sure that every single client who walked through our doors received all the services they needed to heal.
